Chapter 2, Section 208 of the Wyoming Public Service Commission's Procedural Rules and Special Regulations is proposed to be amended to provide public utilities a simpler and more efficient way to consummate normal course of business *de minimis* transactions that have no material effect on either the public or the ability of the utility to provide safe, reliable and adequate service.

The adoption of this amended rule, Chapter 2, Section 208, allows certain narrow exceptions to the application requirements under the old rule. Currently, Section 208 requires a filing for authority in the case of all transactions, it has become apparent that this rule should be amended to allow certain narrow exceptions in order to assure compliance by utilities and to reduce the administrative burden of processing transactions that are, because of their nature and small size, not relevant or necessary. The amended Section 208 would allow utilities to consummate certain *de minimis* normal business transactions without prior Commission approval and would require a semi-annual report of such transactions. The proposed rule change meets minimum substantive state statutory requirements.
