

PUBLIC NOTICE

Pursuant to the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act and the Wyoming Public Service Commission's (Commission) Rules, the Commission hereby gives notice of the Application of Thunder Basin Pipeline, LLC (Thunder Basin or the Company), for approval of a transfer of certain utility assets pursuant to Wyo. Stat. § 37-1-104.

Thunder Basin is a public utility as defined in Wyo. Stat. § 37-1-101(a)(vi)(G), subject to the Commission's jurisdiction under Wyo. Stat. § 37-2-112.

Thunder Basin is a Delaware Limited Liability Company authorized to transact business in the state of Wyoming and engaged in the business of operating an intrastate crude oil gathering and transportation pipeline system in Converse and Niobrara Counties. Thunder Basin is a wholly-owned indirect subsidiary of Genesis Energy, L.P. Its principal place of business is located at 919 Milam St., Ste. 2100, Houston, TX 77042. Powder River Operating is a Delaware Limited Liability Company authorized to do business in Wyoming. It is engaged in interstate transportation of crude oil and provides facilities and services to direct and indirect subsidiaries of Genesis Energy, L.P. (Genesis) that are subject to the jurisdiction of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission. SCM PR, LLC (SCM) is a Delaware Limited Liability Company headquartered in Irving, Texas. SCM is engaged in crude oil gathering, storage, and terminaling services in Wyoming.

Thunder Basin was granted a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity in Docket No. 50054-1-PA-13 (Record No. 13285). Thunder Basin states that its pipeline system is currently idle and non-operational.

Thunder Basin filed its Application with the Commission on September 7, 2018, requesting approval of the transfer of certain assets from Thunder Basin to an entity that alleges it does not provide intrastate service and is not subject to the Commission's jurisdiction. Thunder Basin intends following facilities to be transferred:

- i. the Douglas Booster Station (Station), including real property located at 750 Dickau Road in Shawnee, Wyoming, together with pipelines, tankage and terminaling facilities at the Station;
- ii. a 10,00-barrel shell capacity tank and related appurtenances (Southwell Draw Tank) located on the site of the Station; and
- iii. two truck-unloads and related equipment (sample pots, meters, pumps, valves and related appurtenances (Truck-Unloads) located on the site of the Station to Powder River Operating, LLC (Powder River Operating).

Thunder Basin states that Genesis is in the process of selling Powder River Operating to SCM and intends to complete the transfer of Power River Operating in September 2018. However, Genesis is not selling Thunder Basin, the Commission-regulated utility. If for some reason the acquisition by SCM does not occur, Thunder Basin states it still intends to transfer the Station, South Well Draw Truck Tank and the Truck Unloads to Powder River Operating. The Company states the utility facilities at issue in the Application are not used for intrastate gathering or transportation services. The Station, South Well Draw Tank and the Truck Unloads are currently used exclusively as locations to receive and store crude oil that is transported interstate. Once the

utility facilities are transferred to Powder River Operating, the Company represents the utility facilities will be used exclusively for interstate crude oil transportation functions only and alleges they will not be under the jurisdiction of the Commission.

Thunder Basin states that its system is idle and the transfer of the utility facilities will have no impact on the provision of intrastate utility service by Thunder Basin or any other entity.

This is not a complete description of the Application. The Application is on file with the Commission at its offices in Cheyenne, Wyoming, and may be inspected there by any interested person during regular business hours.

Anyone desiring to intervene and become a party to this proceeding or to file a statement, comment, protest, or request a hearing in this matter, must file the same with the Commission in writing on or before October 29, 2018. Any petitions for intervention or hearing shall set forth the grounds of the proposed intervention or request for hearing and the position and interest of the petitioner.
