

## PUBLIC NOTICE

Pursuant to the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act and the Wyoming Public Service Commission (Commission) Rules, the Commission hereby gives notice of the Application of SQF, LLC (SQF or the Company) for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN) to provide intrastate local exchange telecommunication services within the State of Wyoming, as more fully described herein.

SQF is a telecommunications company as defined by Wyo. Stat. § 37-15-103(a)(xi), subject to the Commission's jurisdiction pursuant to Wyo. Stat. § 37-15-401.

SQF is a Maine limited liability company and represents it is legally qualified to do business in Wyoming. The Company provided a Certificate of Formation issued in the State of Maine on July 11, 2012. The Company represents it possesses all of the requisite approvals and authorities to transact business as a limited liability company within Wyoming and received its Certificate of Authority from the State of Wyoming on April 24, 2018.

On May 24, 2018, SQF filed its Application seeking certificate authority to provide facilities-based services through construction of SQF owned fiber networks and infrastructure housing small cellular equipment leased to other carriers, primarily wireless carriers, on a "build-to-suit" basis. SQF states the location of its networks is typically dictated by the needs of individual carrier customers and the increased demand for data and voice services on these carriers' networks. The Application states SQF relies on existing facilities in the deployment of its networks through utility pole owner attachment agreements and leased fiber. However, in many instances, SQF states it utilizes its own infrastructure and equipment. SQF represents it intends to service, initially and in the future, all exchanges operated by the incumbent local exchange carriers (ILECs) operating within the State of Wyoming that are open to competition, except in those service areas any small or rural local exchange carriers having fewer than 5,000 access lines. SQF's customers include wireless internet service providers (ISPs), public safety network operators, competitive local exchange carriers (CLECs), and cellular carriers.

In support of its Application, SQF asserts it has sufficient technical, financial, and managerial resources to provide safe, adequate and reliable local exchange telecommunications services within Wyoming, as provided by Wyo. Stat. § 37-15-201(b). The Company states it is willing to provide additional information concerning this issue in response to specific inquiries from the Commission.

SQF's Application is on file with the Commission at its offices in Cheyenne, Wyoming, and may be inspected by any interested persons during regular business hours.

Anyone desiring to intervene as a party, file a statement, comment, or protest or request a hearing in this matter must do so by filing with the Commission, in writing, on or before July 11, 2018. Please reference Docket No. 70255-1-TA-18 (Record No. 15003) in your correspondence. The petition shall set forth the grounds of the proposed intervention or request for hearing, and the position and interest of the petitioner in this proceeding.
